During the 2023–24 school year, CityTutor DC reached a milestone moment: we've now served more than **16,000 students** since our launch in 2021. What began as an urgent COVID recovery initiative has become a lasting pillar of DC's education strategy—and we are proud to be the quiet engine driving it forward.

This year, DC emerged on the national stage as a model for high-impact tutoring (HIT). The Washington Post spotlighted Stanford University research validating the approach: tutoring not only accelerates academic progress, but also boosts attendance and strengthens students' connection to school. On WETA's Politics Hour, DCPS Chancellor Lewis Ferebee underscored the District's continued local investment. And across the city, stakeholders are asking: has tutoring paid off?

The answer—confirmed by rigorous data—is **yes.**

While CityTutor DC is not always named, we're behind much of what's working. In the 2023–24 school year, we helped implement HIT at more than **50 new school sites**, partnered with DCPS and public charter schools, coached new tutoring providers, and delivered the guidance and infrastructure needed to ensure every program met a high bar for quality, alignment, and equity.

The impact speaks volumes:

- We reached the students who needed it most.
 80% of tutored students were Black, and 67%
 were designated at-risk, reinforcing tutoring's potential as a strategy for educational equity.
- Students grew—and grew faster.
 Tutored students exceeded national benchmarks on interim assessments, showing accelerated academic progress.
- Attendance improved.

Thanks to the trusting, high-touch relationships at the core of effective tutoring, students who received consistent tutoring showed stronger school attendance, particularly those designated at-risk.

Our coalition is stronger than ever.

We convened, trained, and connected hundreds of educators and school leaders, ensuring that HIT is not just implemented, but continuously improved.




CityTutor DC catalyzes tutoring for thousands of students in DC, accelerating academic performance, improving student well-being, and enhancing talent systems in schools.

Throughout this work, we remain committed to the academic and social-emotional success of DC students, especially those furthest from opportunity.

High-impact tutoring (HIT)

increases access to high dosage, relationship-based academic interventions, and grows the number of trained tutors and trusted adults delivering consistent, personalized support that drives student success.

Strategic Staffing

helps schools design flexible staffing models that share instructional responsibilities across teams of adults, better support students and educators, and build a diverse pipeline of future teachers.

Our work is driven by national standards and backed by a growing body of research. CityTutor DC has reached **more than 16,000 students** through tutoring, educator support, and mentorship.



Enduring Impact

We believe in empowering schools to achieve lasting change from within.

CityTutor DC's model of co-designing launch plans with school teams has lasting benefits across the ecosystem. The launch plans are rooted in schools' models, cultures, and student populations to ensure they are designing evidence-based interventions with corresponding schedules and staffing to serve students in a targeted, equitable way that is sustainable over time.

This model ensures that this work is not dependent on CityTutor DC's continued presence, but rather becomes a self-sustaining part of a school's ongoing cycle of improvement and growth.

High-Impact Tutoring Works

Tutoring & Academic Recovery

The U.S. Department of Education's 2024 National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) and Harvard and Stanford's Education Recovery Scorecard showed Washington, D.C. outperformed national trends on academic recovery. Our work has helped position the District as a national proof point and high-impact tutoring as a targeted, early intervention for academic achievement and success among marginalized students.

Private tutoring is surging in wealthier communities, while the gaps persist and widen, for public schools serving students furthest from opportunity. High-impact tutoring (HIT) has helped close learning gaps and deliver consistent, relationship-based academic support where it's needed most.

This year, in partnership with 11 providers and more than 80 schools, CityTutor DC supported more than 600 trained tutors, with students in one-on-one or small-group settings, to deliver tutoring at a high dosage: at least **90 minutes** per week over 10 weeks. In the 2023–24 school year, students who received 900 or more minutes of tutoring were more likely to meet their academic goals than their non-tutored peers. Among high school tutored students receiving HIT, **77%** met their target growth goals in math, alongside **69%** of students identified as at-risk. In English Language Arts (ELA), **72%** of English Learner students met their growth goals.

Two More Months of Academic Growth from Math Tutoring

A 2024 study by EmpowerK12 found that students receiving high-impact tutoring in math made academic gains equivalent to an additional two months of instruction. Well-designed, intensive tutoring is one of the most powerful tools we have to close performance gaps and accelerate learning.

Personalized academic support builds trust and deepens engagement. Students who receive high-impact tutoring attend school more consistently, feel more connected to their learning, and trust the adults supporting them. Tutors know students by name, check in when they miss school, and help them feel successful, academically and emotionally. In the 2023–24 school year, students led by a trusted tutor exceeded their expected growth by an additional 44% and reported a stronger sense of belonging in school.



The District's multi-year investment in HIT is allowing almost a third of Truth students to get small group tutoring in math four days a week. This not only doubles the amount of math instruction they are getting, but it does so in the most personalized way possible. It has made a critical difference for our students who have been struggling with math through these post-pandemic years."

Strategic Staffing

In the 2023–24 school year, CityTutor DC partnered with schools across the district to address teacher turnover, burnout, and stress, and move toward a more sustainable and redesigned approach to school staffing. This year, our team worked alongside school leaders to co-design instruction models tailored to the unique structures of each school and the specific challenges of each unique community. Schools co-designed strategic staffing solutions to design schools that are better for their educators, schools, and the students they serve.

Moving away from the traditional "one teacher, one classroom" model, schools shifted toward teambased models that allow them to share teaching responsibility across a team of adults. Through these models, teachers lean into their strengths and focus on the areas of instruction and social-emotional development where they are at their strongest.

Team-based models also enable schools to integrate more adults, including tutors, onto their instructional teams. With more adults supporting more students, schools are poised to optimize classrooms to better serve student needs. Furthermore, in team-based models, educators gain greater autonomy, decision-making power, and flexibility in their school day.

Across the year, CityTutor DC facilitated three Communities of Practice and led two Design Sprints. Schools walked away from Design Sprint programming with redesigned schedules that enabled dynamic, student-centered grouping along with plans to build stronger systems to support innovative strategic staffing models in their schools...

Talent Pipeline

Emerging data from 2023-2024 suggested that tutoring builds a diverse talent pipeline for schools, with LEA partners reporting that local tutors are entering into full-time teaching roles at impressive rates. Next year, CityTutor DC will launch our inaugural Tutor-to-Teacher program to strengthen and diversify the pipeline of future teachers.





First Annual DC High-Impact Tutoring Summit

Our work and impact have always stemmed from the strength of our coalition. In Fall 2024, CityTutor DC and the DC Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE) co-hosted the **First Annual DC High-Impact Tutoring (HIT) Summit** to recognize HIT's success over the past year. More than 200 educators, tutoring providers, local policymakers, and school and systems leaders gathered to learn from each other and chart the path ahead for even deeper impact.

Mayor Bowser attended and announced a local investment of **\$4.8M** to be included in her FY25 budget to sustain the great work of conference attendees!

A Brighter Future:

Learnings from Transforming Teaching

CityTutor DC celebrated key findings and lessons learned from our Transforming Teaching Pilot at **A Brighter Future: Learnings from Transforming Teaching** in 2024. Paul Kihn, Deputy Mayor for Education, and Jazzmyne Townsend, 2025 DC Teacher of the Year, kicked off the event and were joined by leaders from the Office of the State Superintendent of Education (OSSE), DC Public Schools, DC Scholars PCS, and New America for a panel discussion. Together, we shared newly designed principles for a more sustainable and equitable teaching profession and explored how to scale successful team—teaching models and reach more teachers, students, and schools across the district.

91% felt they could activate other leaders in support of transforming teaching efforts because they participated in the event.
